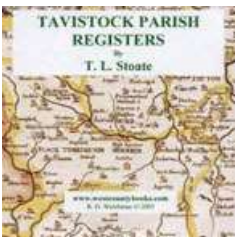


Sampford Courtenay Parish Registers (Edited by T.L. Stoate)
